





I was for the first time attending the International Kinus Hashlichus in New York. I had recently moved far away to Tasmania, and I was feeling lonely, confused and ambivalent.

I went to get breakfast, and sit on my own on a table at the other end of the large hall. I didn't know anyone and had no confidence to sit on a table with women whom I didn't know. Honestly I was feeling overwhelmed by the sheer number of women there, and little, young me travelling alone from a place that most American's had never heard of (What part of Africa do you live? You live in New Zealand, right?)

A woman approached me and asked if she could sit next to me. We made some small talk, and played Jewish geography. She said that she saw me looking alone and figured she would strike up a conversation -She instantly made me feel at ease and comfortable. She also immediately understood many of the challenges I was experiencing - the living far away, living on an Island, homeschooling, isolation, lack of Kosher food, no Mikvah....

After this encounter, she took my number and often messaged me for updates and just to check up on me. She made it her business to show she cared and to make me feel like I wasn't alone.

Subsequently every year, when we met at the kinus, she greeted me like a best friend, and I knew she genuinely cared.

To say that Hashem takes the best is an understatement. 😥



You set a blanket on the floor and had everyone sitting together, explaining to them what happened, and asking each one about the experience. I will never forget those moments on the floor. I was looking at you and the kids with a huge admiration for how you have raised them. Their ability to handle rough situations in life, their wisdom, Kidush Hashem, and the care for each other is beyond incredible. You showed me that motherhood is about the energy you pass to your children. A few days before the tragedy you sent me a message reminding me of that day, calling it a sweet memory, even when I almost burned your house and you had to replace this whole part of the kitchen. This was the person you were. Always positive, welcoming, loving and caring. Never made it to this last Shabbat with you... I became a mother 10 months ago and had the honor to have you and rabbi Asher host Reef's Brit at the new synagogue. Your light will always shine in our hearts, and I will raise my son knowing who you were for us, teaching him your kindness and Derech Eretz. We love you always and forever 💔

As soon as that was over we headed out to the engagement parties. Meeting up with more friends we shared with Henya, yet celebrating the simcha of these brides and grooms.

On Thursday morning the convention began. This was not an easy one. It's always the highlight of the year. Everyone I know was on the same emotional roller coaster. We hugged and cried. So happy to see each other but oy, what a heavy load.

The convention, planned over the entire year, had to quickly change course. One of our sisters was being led to her final resting place. No way could workshops happen at that time. As the funeral procession stopped in front of headquarters, at 770 Eastern Parkway, thousands of women stood there to pray and wish a final farewell to someone who was a friend to everyone she encountered. No one should ever ever have to witness the pain seen there. I continued on to the cemetery where Henya was laid to rest. Close by to our Rebbe, whom she gave up all her personal comforts for - to live a life of giving as the Rebbe inspired her to - in the Virgin Islands. There were so many who came to the funeral. We met some of her friends from the Islands, and many from around the world. There was one common thing. Tears. Lots of them. No one could hold them back. How could it be? And yet we knew, in 40 short years, Henya had completed her mission in this world. Her family and friends are in pain as she moves up to a higher and better place. We are left behind with a gaping hole. She is ok.

Driving back to Brooklyn and back to the convention with a car full of friends and relatives, to head back to the official opening dinner of the convention, we spoke about Henya. We also spoke about regular life. We had to switch gears. Back to other emotions where we can be happy for seeing those we love. Spending a weekend together in a great environment. Even while missing Henya. Sitting at dinner, listening to friends with amazing lessons to share, learning, being inspired, and feeling Henya in my heart.

And now, staying in my cousin's house, with 20 other family members who came in for this convention (and my cousin's family who also isn't small :-)) you can imagine there is a lot of happy energy here. (Yes we squish and we love it!) We will go into shabbos in a really happy space, while still holding Henya with us. And the roller coaster keeps on doing its twists and turns.

The peer group of boys and girls in Milwaukee, now all grown, will continue to inspire others the way Ray Asher and Rebbetzin Henya inspired all of us. May Henya bas HaRay Yisroel & Bracha Devorah Leah (may G-d bless them both with many happy healthy years) and her daughter Shterna Sarah bas HaRay Asher Yaakov rest in peace, may their family find much comfort and strength, and may they join us in Heaven as we cry out on Earth "enough tzaros!! Moshiach Now!!"

הניה ואנה. אנה והניה.


